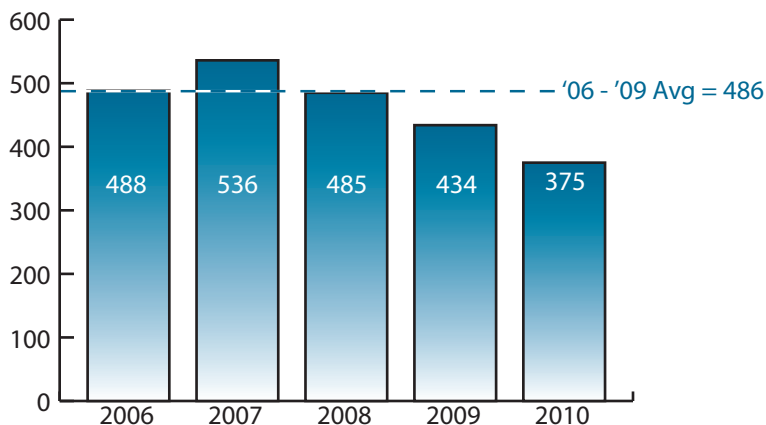


SOUTH CAROLINA TRAFFIC FATALITY REPORT FOR 2010

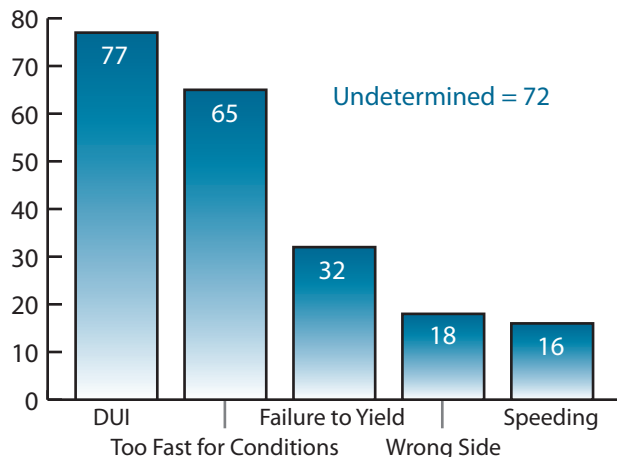

2006 - 2010 Fatality Comparison through June



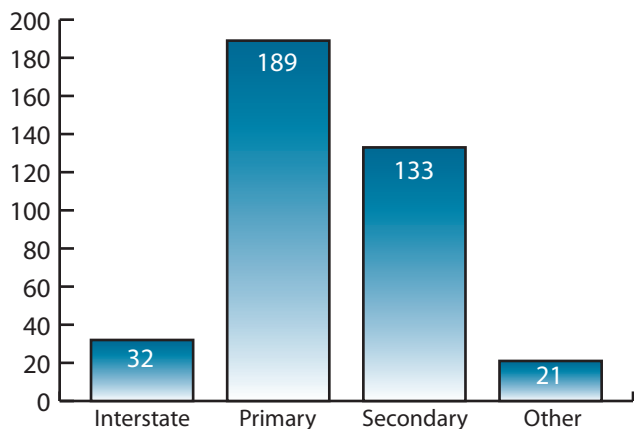
Preliminary statistics indicate fatalities are 111 (23%) below the previous 4-year average and 59 (14%) below the same period in 2009.

Top Probable Causes



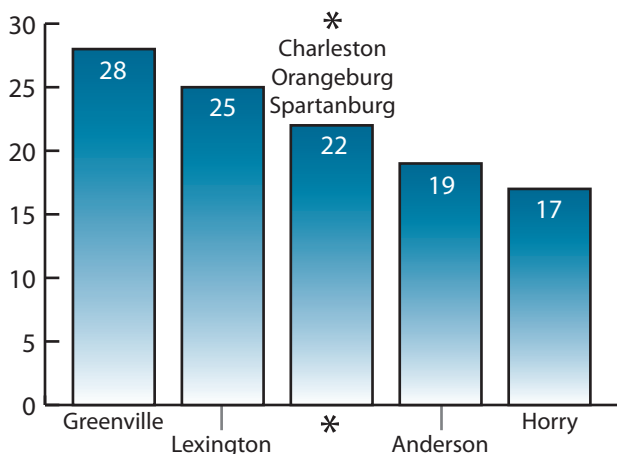
The leading probable cause for traffic fatalities during the first four months of 2010 continues to be DUI, although by a smaller margin than in previous months.

Fatalities by Route Category



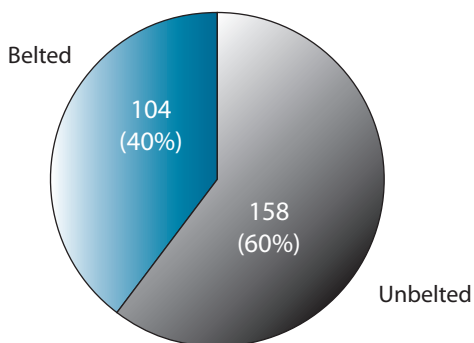
Through June, only 32 fatalities were reported on the Interstates, less than 1/10 of the total fatalities in 2010.

Top Fatality Counties



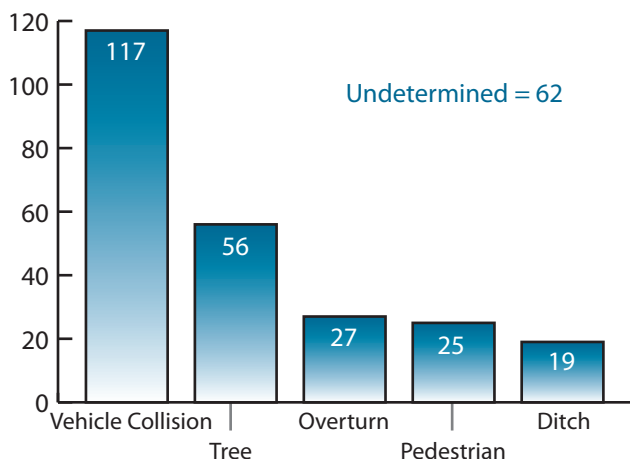
Ten Counties had 15 or more traffic fatalities during the first six months of 2010. In addition to the seven shown in the graph, the three additional counties are Florence (16), Aiken (15), and York (15).

Fatalities by Restraint Usage



This graphic does not include 113 people (pedestrians, motorcyclists and others) who were killed and did not have access to restraints.

Top Crash Events



The leading crash event is the collision between two or more vehicles while in motion. Single vehicle collisions, so far, are not as prevalent as in 2009.
