## 9. Secretary of Transportation Report

9.1 Secretary of Transportation Report

Secretary Powell began the Secretary of Transportation Report reporting that this calendar year through September 5, 2025, there have been 600 traffic fatalities; according to the Department of Public Safety Statistics, this is down 92 fatalities (or 13%) from this time last year. Of the vulnerable road users, there were 103 pedestrian fatalities (down 3 from this time last year), 9 bicycle fatalities (down 15 from this time last year), and 7 moped fatalities (down from 7 this time last year).

SCDOT continues to increase its work program. The current active construction program is at \$6.5 billion under contract. This fluctuates around \$7 billion; when projects are completed and paid, they are removed from the list. In the next few months, there will be an increase in this value with a series of bridge lettings and September paving contracts.

Secretary Powell reviewed the On-Time and On-Budget numbers for the Construction Program: 81% of the projects are on-time and 19% had penalties assessed for not being on-time. The agency was tracking at 1.22% below the original bid. The largest categories of our statewide construction program are "interstate widenings" and "pavements." Thanks to the SC General Assembly, there will be an increase in the bridge category in the next few months.

There were a series of change orders totaling approximately \$6.18 million greater than \$250,000 in active contracts for July 1 through July 31, 2025. There were 9 projects with change orders that were discussed: 2 projects were Design-Build, 3 projects were related to field conditions, and 4 miscellaneous issues.

Secretary Powell reported his authorization of 4 emergency procurements for a roadway repairs on Fants Grove Road in Anderson County, Bridge Repairs on US 17A over SCL Railroad and Yemassee Highway in Hampton County, Bridge Replacement on SC 133 (Crowe Creek Road) over Crow Creek in Pickens County, and Bridge Repairs on US 17 SB over S. Santee River and US 17 SB over N. Santee River in Georgetown County.

Secretary Powell reviewed the 10-Year Plan Accomplishments at "Year Eight" and reported that:

- <u>RURAL ROAD SAFETY</u>: 1209 miles have been addressed in the Rural Road Safety Program (RRSP) with a target of 1300 miles.
- <u>PAVING</u>: More than 9,709 miles of paving have been addressed in every county of the State.
- BRIDGES: 431 bridges have advanced to construction with a target of 530-bridges.
- INTERSTATE: 121 interstate miles have advanced to construction.

Secretary Powell referred to the Interstate Modernization map that showed 75 miles completed, 46 miles in construction, 121 miles in design, and 213 miles in the planning stage.

He reviewed the New Gas Tax Trust Fund as of July 31, 2025. He stated over \$5.2 billion of revenue has been generated since July 1, 2017, with \$4.9 billion put towards construction projects. Since the start of the 2017 Roads Bill, SCDOT continues to program projects with the goal of getting the infrastructure to a state of "Good" repair.

There were 15 surplus properties conveyed since the July 2025 Commission meeting, totaling \$280,500.00 in property sales.

He also revealed several accomplishments since the July Commission meeting to include, but not limited to, I-95 Groundbreaking, the "Fix the Drive" website, and the Innovation Challenge Awards.

## 10. New Business (Action Required)

#### 10.1 10-Year Plan Revision

Deputy Secretary McCottry began his presentation recapping the allocations to SCDOT for one-time funding for \$200M for Bridge Modernization and \$35M for Hurricane Helene costs. Additionally, at the federal level, SCDOT received \$175M in a Bridge Investment Program (BIP) Grant awarded for I-95 over Lake Marion and \$195M Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant (MPDG) Grant awarded for I-526 for the Long Point Road Project. SCDOT is also increasing the maintenance category for "signing and pavement markings" from \$8.875M to \$15M annually. He provided the accomplishments to date of the rural road safety program, miles of paving, number of replaced/repaired bridges, and the number of interstate miles with work underway.

The target of 530 bridges was also discussed with a recommendation to increase this to 550. After questions and discussions, a motion was made.

MOTION: 10-Year Plan Revision

"The Secretary is directed to adjust the 10-Year Plan and Statewide Transportation Improvement Plan to add the anticipated state and federal funds to increase existing program levels. The Secretary recommends to increase the performance target for Bridges to 550."

The Commission unanimously approved the motion.

### 10.2 FY 26-27 Budget Submission

Deputy McCottry also presented the FY26-27 Proposed Budget of approximately \$3.21B. Generally, the state revenues are stagnant in the four major categories of motor fuel tax, car sales tax, DMV fees, and General Fund. SCDOT will likely receive the same level of federal apportionments under IIJA, the current federal reauthorization bill. SCDOT intends to request:

- the continuation of the \$120M in recurring funds for federal aid match,
- \$300M Recurring for bridges: Recurring annually to ensure long-term mobility and freight movement by tackling bridges in corridor-specific approach,

- \$25M Recurring for Buyback Program which is a voluntary road transfer program with the goal of right-sizing the state highway system,
- \$5.1M for the payment to PRT for Welcome Centers, and
- \$5M in recurring funds for off-interstate litter pick-up. This follows a non-recurring appropriation in FY 26 to support off-interstate litter pick-up that is currently underway.

SCDOT will also propose deleting proviso 117.100 for welcome centers and the transfer of \$5,140,727 to Department of Parks, Recreation, and Tourism for maintenance of Welcome Centers. There is also a proposed addition to section 84 for the Road Buyback Program where we are establishing a voluntary road transfer program with the goal of right sizing the state highway system. After questions and discussions, a motion was made.

"Based on the forecasted revenues and expenditures as presented, recommend approval of the proposed \$3.21 billion dollar budget authority request for State Fiscal Year 2026-27. "

"Staff is directed to proceed with preparing the necessary submittals and, under the authority of the Secretary of Transportation, adjusting the budget as necessary to account for variances between forecasts and actuals."

Commissioner Blackwell expressed his desire to have the budget numbers provided in future years as early as possible for the Commission to review.

The Commission approved the motion.

10.3 Changes to the State Highway System (Highway)

Deputy Secretary McCottry "requested the Commission's approval of the additions, deletions, and revisions to the State Highway System as shown in the Agenda Package and the authority to convey right of way to appropriate entities. This request includes 46 segments of the Secondary Road System resulting in a reduction to the Secondary System of 3.191-centerline mile equating to 6.382 lane miles."

The Commission approved the motion.

### 10.4 21-Day Public Comment Period

Deputy Secretary Quattlebaum "requested the Commission's approval to initiate a 21-Day Public Comment Period and amend the 2024-2033 Statewide Transportation Improvement program (STIP) for the following projects:

Addition of Preliminary Engineering and Construction phases of work for a Bridge Replacement and an Intersection Improvement project. SCDOT certified that the bridge is closed and consistent with Commission Policy, automatically advance and ranked as a high priority project.

A. Bridge Replacement – US-17 Alt over SCL RR and S-25-1 (Closed) – Edgefield County

B. Intersection Improvement – Project Speedway Local Access Road – Pickens County"

10.5 Revision of the 2024-2033 STIP, Highway

Deputy Secretary Quattlebaum "requested the Commission's approval for the Revision of the 2024-2033 Statewide Transportation to include:

- A. Inclusion of one (1) new project into the CHATS MPO System Upgrade Urban Program.
- B. Inclusion of one (1) new project into the CHATS MPO System Upgrade Urban Program.
- C. Inclusion of five (5) new projects into the Central Midlands COG System Upgrade Rural Program.
- D. Inclusion of three (3) new projects and the removal of one (1) project in the COATS MPO System Upgrade Urban Program.
- E. Amendment of one (1) new project in the COATS MPO System Upgrade Urban Program."

The Commission approved the request.

10.6 Revision of the 2024-2033 STIP, Transit

Motion by: Commissioner Hemingway Second by: Commissioner Christopher

Deputy Secretary Necker "requested the Commission's approval for an amendment of the 2024-2033 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) to include the following Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Large and Small urbanized Area Mass Transit projects:

- A. Inclusion of COATS MPO FTA Section 5310 Large Urbanized Area Enhanced Mobility of Seniors & Individuals with Disabilities Formula Program funds in the amount of \$422,488 for FY2026 Capital funds suballocated to Babcock Center to purchase four (4) ADA passenger vehicles. Inclusion of COATS MPO FTA Section 5310 Large Urbanized Area Enhanced Mobility of Seniors & Individuals with Disabilities Formula Program funds in the amount of \$340,000 for FY2026 Capital funds suballocated to Central Midlands RTS (CMRTA) for Purchase and Service program.
- B. Inclusion of Greenville Transit Authority FFY2025 FTA Section 5307 Large Urbanized Area Formula Program funds full apportionment in the amount of \$1,631,856 for Operations expenses. Inclusion of Greenville Transit

Authority FFY2025 FTA Section 5307 Large Urbanized Area Formula Program funds full apportionment in the amount of \$2,353,303 for Capital expenses. Inclusion of FFY2025 FTA Section 5310 Large Urbanized Area Enhanced Mobility of Seniors & Individuals with Disabilities Formula Program funds in the amount of \$365,000 for Greenville Transit Authority Capital Expenses. Inclusion of FFY2025 FTA Section 5339 Large Urbanized Area bus and Bus Facilities Program finds in the amount of \$306,483 allocated to Greenville Transit Authority for Capital expenses.

- C. Inclusion of Mauldin-Simpsonville FTA Section 5307 Small Urbanized Area Program funds full apportionment in the amount of \$1,231,869 for FY2025 Operating expenses. Inclusion of Mauldin-Simpsonville FTA Section 5307 Small Urbanized Area Program funds in the amount of \$1,776,479 for FY2025 Capital expenses.
- D. Inclusion of GPATS MPO FFY2025 FTA Section 5310 Large Urbanized Area Enhanced Mobility of Seniors & Individuals with Disabilities Formula Program funds in the amount of \$182,500 to be sub-allocated for Non-Profit Transportation Provider Capital Expenses in FY2025.
- E. Inclusion of Pee Dee RTA FFY2024 FTA Section 5307 Small Urbanized Area Formula funds for FFY2026 Capital expenses in the amount of \$804,250 and Operations expenses in the amount of \$839,339."

### 13. Executive Session

A motion was made to go into Executive Session pursuant to the SC Code 30-4-70(a) (2) to discuss Contractual Matters Related to Project Agreements on I-77. Chairman Johnson

asked certain personnel to join the Commissioners in the Executive Boardroom. The recorder was turned off.

The Commission approved ending the Executive Session.

There were no votes taken in Executive Session nor did the Commission commit itself to a course of action.

Motion by: Commissioner Blackwell Second by: Commissioner Hemingway

Secretary Powell read a motion to partner with NCDOT in an I-77 Partnership Agreement.

"The Commission finds that the upcoming I-77 South Express Lanes project being pursued by the North Carolina Department of Transportation intends to add additional capacity to the North Carolina side of I-77 between the South Carolina border and Uptown Charlotte.

As a result of that initiative, the Commission finds that the I-77 South Express Lanes project will have significant engineering considerations to the operation of I-77 on both sides of the border.

The Commission finds that safe and efficient cross-border operations is a significant engineering consideration necessary to avoid future delays and congestion as a result of improvements occurring on I-77 in North Carolina absent coordination or improvement to South Carolina's segment of I-77.

The Commission finds that York County in conjunction with the State Transportation Infrastructure Bank is pursuing an improvement to Exit 90 approximately 2,000 feet from the North Carolina border and that North Carolina's I-77 South Express Lanes project will require extensive coordination with the Exit 90 project.

Pursuant to SC Regulation 63-10(c)2 and consistent with the aforementioned findings, the Commission authorizes the Secretary of Transportation to add I-77 Improvements to the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program to improve capacity, mobility, and operations on I-77 between Exit 88 and the North Carolina border necessary for safe and efficient cross-border operations with the North Carolina Department of Transportation's I-77 South Express Lanes project. The project shall also consider operational deficiencies for interchanges and bridges within the corridor, including Exit 90.

Furthermore, the Secretary of Transportation is authorized to negotiate any and all agreements with the North Carolina Department of Transportation, the South Carolina State Transportation Bank, and York County to effectuate improvements necessary to facilitate safe and efficient operations on I-77 at the North Carolina-South Carolina border.

The Commission further moves that this motion is published in the minutes of the Commission as the written justification required in SC Regulation 63-10(c)2."

The Commission approved the request.



- 2. Directs staff to remove all signs or markers on this road commemorating former Sheriff Charles L. "Chuck" Wright.

**And so it is resolved,** this 4<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2025.








## SCDOT's \$6.5 Billion Construction Program







## **Public Comment Summary**

#### 2024-2033 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)

#### **Intersection Improvement Project in Pickens County**

On September 18, 2025, the SCDOT Commission approved the amendment of the 2024-2033 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) to include an intersection improvement project where SC 124 and Crosswell School Road intersect with US 123, near Greenville Pickens Speedway Industrial Park in Pickens County. In accordance with SCDOT's STIP Administration Process and Public Involvement Policy, SCDOT requested public comments on these projects for a twenty-one-day period, which took place from September 18, 2025 to October 8, 2025.

SCDOT received one comment in the form of a question, which asked where to view proposed project plans.

#### **Comment Response**

Thank you for taking the time to comment on SCDOT's 2024-2033 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). SCDOT periodically updates the list of projects included in the STIP through the amendment process, followed by a public announcement and a request for public input. This step creates public awareness about the project and begins a conversation between the public and SCDOT that will continue throughout the project development process. During the preliminary engineering phase of this project, we will share project plans and invite you to comment on a preliminary project design. On September 18, 2025, the SCDOT Commission approved the amendment of the 2024-2033 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) to include a project to replace the closed bridge on US 17 Alternate over SCL Railroad and S-1 in Hampton County. In accordance with SCDOT's STIP Administration Process and Public Involvement Policy, SCDOT requested public comments on these projects for a twenty-one-day period, which took place from September 18, 2025 to October 8, 2025.

SCDOT received two comments from members of the public. Both comments expressed support for the replacement of the bridge. One comment expressed interest in bicycle/pedestrian accommodations and lighting.




## **Metric 1: Programmed Funding**



The South Carolina Department of Transportation (SCDOT) Commission establishes the following policy for Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and Council of Government (COG) Regional Mobility Use Match Responsibility, and Maintenance Responsibility:

- 1) The Commission establishes that SCDOT will provide the required state match for the annual Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) federally funded Regional Mobility allocation to the state's MPOs and COGs for eligible project activities that address the Department's goal of optimizing the existing transportation network through traffic operations, capacity, safety, and multi-modal accessibility improvements.
- 2) SCDOT has established statewide programs to systematically maintain existing pavements and bridge rehabilitation and replacement programs. Regional Mobility funds should not be allocated toward pavement preservation, pavement rehabilitation, pavement reconstruction projects, bridge rehabilitation, or bridge replacement projects. SCDOT shall grant exceptions in the event the work is a part of a larger project consistent with the Department's goal of optimizing the existing transportation network through traffic operations, capacity, safety, and multi-modal accessibility improvements.
- 3) Projects supported by the Regional Mobility program should be selected and funded consistent with the SCDOT Complete Streets Policy and the MPO and COG walking, bicycling, and transit plans envisioned in the Complete Streets Policy.
- 4) In cases where an MPO/COG project is eligible for federal Regional Mobility funding, but is not recommended by the Department for state match due to the improvement being outside the Department's core goals of the Regional Mobility Program, the local jurisdiction must provide the required matching funds, typically set at 20% of the total project cost. In addition, County Transportation Committees (CTCs) may also contribute all or a portion of the required match for Regional Mobility projects. Any financial commitment by a CTC to a Regional Mobility project on the state system will also count towards the county's requirement to spend at least twenty-five percent of their apportionment of C-Funds based on a biennial averaging of expenditures on the state highway system for construction and maintenance.
- 5) Regional Mobility funds shall not be pledged for debt service without recommendation of the Secretary of Transportation and approval of the SCDOT Commission.
- 6) No local government shall commit Regional Mobility funding for any State Transportation Infrastructure Bank, state agency, or federal agency grant application without the

appropriate Policy Committee's approval and approval by the Secretary of Transportation.

- 7) To assist with project delivery and demonstration of yearly fiscal constraint of the TIP and STIP, Regional Mobility advancements can be requested by MPOs and COGs. Advancements are subject to approval by the Secretary of Transportation, and will be reviewed based on need, justification and available financial resources. Advancements shall not exceed three years of annual Regional Mobility allocation (not to exceed a total of \$45 million). The payback of an advancement must occur within four years and will be reflected in the annual financial statement as a deduction of available budget. The Secretary of Transportation may permit deviation from this policy upon extenuating circumstances where an advancement exceeds three years of annual Regional Mobility allocation (not to exceed a total of \$45 million) if the project provides demonstrable statewide significance and shall be communicated at the next Commission meeting.
- 8) The attached guidelines will provide a general policy for Regional Mobility use, match and maintenance responsibility. Some unique cases may arise that require special evaluation and approval of the Commission upon review and recommendation of the Secretary of Transportation.

#### Removal of Roads on the State Highway Secondary System

The Department recommends Commission approval for the removal of certain sections of secondary roads from the State Highway Secondary System. These sections of roads may be removed for one of the following reasons:

- 1. Abandonment of section of relocated highway In accordance with Section 57-5-120 of the Code-of-Laws of South Carolina, the department may abandon as a part of the state highway system any section of highway which may be relocated, and every such section so abandoned as a part of the state highway system shall revert to the jurisdiction of the respective appropriate local authorities involved or be abandoned as a public way.
- 2. Highway transfers from the state secondary system In accordance with Section 57-5-80 of the Code-of-Laws of South Carolina, The department may transfer from the state highway secondary system any road under its jurisdiction, determined by the department to be of low traffic importance, to a governmental or non-governmental entity if mutual consent is reached between the department and the party that the road is being transferred to.
- 3. Court ordered closure In accordance with Section 57-9-20 of the Code-of-Laws of South Carolina, an entity may petition the circuit court to have a road closed. The Department is notified of the petition if the road is maintained by the Department, and has an opportunity to contest the petition if the road is of high traffic importance. If the court shall determine that it is in the best interest of all concerned that such street, road or highway be abandoned or closed, the court shall then determine in whom the title thereto shall be vested and issue an appropriate order.

#### **Revision of Description of State Highways**

The Department recommends Commission approval of the revision of the description of sections of State Highway previously added to the State Highway System. The description of roads currently in the State Highway System may be changed for relocation purposes, to revise the description of the termini to show what was actually constructed by contract, county line changes, or a change in the road number.

#### Additions to State Highway Secondary System

The Department recommends Commission approval to add sections of road to the State Highway Secondary. On June 21, 2007, the commission implemented a policy to reduce the secondary road system by:

- Seeking legislative changes to the system laws;
- Lowering county road caps when a secondary road is removed from the system<sup>1</sup>;
- Exchanging roads with local governments; and
- Accepting only roads into the system that are necessary for interconnectivity of the state system or is a road considered a major collector with significant traffic volumes

• The secondary road cap for a county may be increased when a road meeting the above criteria is added to the system at the Department's request or when corrections to the existing road mileage is made and results in an increase in the total mileage above the cap.

<sup>1</sup>County caps were previously implemented by the commission in 1994.

### Rescind Action Adding Roads to State Highway Secondary System

The Department recommends the Commission rescind its previous actions adding roads to the State Highway Secondary System for construction and maintenance. The Department may rescind action on roads, which have not been constructed and formally accepted into the State Highway Secondary System. Roads may be rescinded due to right-of-way being unavailable, problems arising during construction, or funding issues.

#### Transfer between Secondary and Primary Systems

The Department recommends Commission approval to transfer sections of road from the Secondary System to the Primary System, or vice versa. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 57-5-50 of the Code-of-Laws of South Carolina, the Commission may transfer any route or section of route from the state highway secondary system to the state highway primary system, or vice versa, when, in its judgment, such transfer is advisable to better serve the traveling public. However, pursuant to the provisions of Section 57-5-30, the Primary System shall not exceed ten thousand centerline miles.
