








Conditions are Improving




\$2.5 Billion from the new gas tax has funded more than 7,000 miles of paving projects all across the state.

Significant progress has been made and work has been accelerated, now is the time to close any remaining gaps.




A Surge in Bridge Funding is Needed \$200 Million per year for 5 years

Many of the **1,778** bridges on the Interstates and major Primary Routes are more than 60 years old.

1,125 or 63% are rapidly approaching the time for replacement or repair.
